

## LITIGATOR JUST GOT BIGGER AND BETTER!

### New Court Document Collections

Litigator now contains actual court documents from cases reported in the *Business Law Reports* (BLR) and the *Real Property Reports* (RPR), providing you with access to tens of thousands of pleadings, motions, and facta relevant to these practice areas. This is in addition to Litigator's existing collection of court documents from the *Carswell's Practice Cases* (CPC), *Canadian Cases on the Law of Insurance* (CCLI), *Canadian Cases on the Law of Torts* (CCLT), and *Canadian Cases on Employment Law* (CCEL).

Access the two new court document collections through Litigator's custom search templates:

## HOME PAGE CHANGES

You now have the flexibility to search Motion and Application Facta separate from Appeal Facta. New links on the home page will take you to custom search templates for each factum type, allowing you to search with more precision:

## SEARCH CUSTOMIZATION

With the new Court Document Search Templates (Pleadings, Motions, Motion/Application Facta, and Appeal Facta), you now have a choice: you can change nothing and continue to enjoy the familiarity of existing search techniques OR you can customize which content is to be included in a search.

In most cases, there will be no need to decide which content to include in your search as the search template will automatically default to the content to which you subscribe. However, there may be times when you wish to tailor your searches, either by including Litigator content that is outside of your subscription, or by restricting your search to a subset of content to which you subscribe. The new Court Document Gallery templates give you this flexibility.

To add content, simply select from the databases in the left pane. Your selection will appear in the list of databases to be searched in the right pane.

To narrow your search, you can remove content from the pre-populated list of search databases by clicking the **Remove** link next to the database name.
