### A New Way of Delivering The Canadian Abridgment eDigests

We are pleased to announce a new way of delivering The Canadian Abridgment eDigests to you.

Now, rather than sending you a *separate* email for each eDigest that you are entitled to, we'll send a **single email** that allows you to quickly link to a convenient Acrobat file of all of the eDigests available for your subscription. Not only that, from this email you'll be able to quickly link to an archive where previous weeks' eDigests will be housed, saving you the trouble of downloading and archiving these files on your own.

As always, the full text of any case included in The Canadian Abridgment eDigests may be directly retrieved by simply clicking on the case citation link located at the bottom of each case digest and signing-on to Westlaw®CARSWELL.

This change will take effect May 6, 2005 when the scheduled original email format will not be sent and will be replaced by the new email format which will be sent May 10, 2005. The new format eDigests will be sent every Tuesday.

#### *Why this change?*

We've been listening to requests from subscribers saying that they would like to reduce the number of emails they receive. This change also makes it possible for us to add additional Abridgment eDigest topics without adding to the number of emails we send to you.
