

NOTE UP REGULATIONS WITH KEYCITE CANADA!

We are pleased to announce the arrival of KeyCiteCanada for Regulations, which enables you to find judicial treatments of regulations on WestlawCARSWELL. This capability is included as part of all WestlawCARSWELL subscriptions.

From the time WestlawCARSWELL was launched in 2002, users have been able to use its citator service, KeyCiteCanada, to find Canadian judicial treatments of statutes and rules, reflecting the content of our print legislative citators, **Canadian Statute Citations** and **Rules Judicially Considered**. In 2005 we added a new print service – **Regulations Judicially Considered** – completing our suite of legislative citators. This work now forms the basis of our extension of KeyCite, which provides not only the most comprehensive Canadian citator available online, but the only citator that allows you to note up all primary law: cases, tribunal decisions, statutes, rules and regulations.

COVERAGE

What Regulations can you KeyCite?

You can KeyCite any regulation that has been cited in a Canadian case decided since 1997. Any regulatory provision cited in these cases is included, whether it is currently in force or historic, whether it is Canadian or foreign, whether or not we have that particular regulation in full text on our service.

What Citing References will you see?

1. Citing references derived from judicial or tribunal decisions on our service since 1997.

These citing references include all judicial treatments found in the print service **Regulations Judicially Considered**.

Note: As is the case with our print **Regulations Judicially Considered** service, all judicial treatments of regulations in cases received after October 2005 have been analyzed by our editorial staff and have been assigned our customary legislative treatment indicators – **Considered, Referred to, Pursuant to and Unconstitutional**. However, judicial treatments of regulations in cases received prior October 2005 have been identified by our editorial staff but not analyzed. For these judicial treatments, you will see a new indicator – **Treatment not designated**.

2. References drawn from select secondary sources

Some treatises and annotated services on WestlaweCARSWELL contain hypertext links to important regulations. An example is the Federal Child Support Guidelines. When you KeyCite a section of the Child Support Guidelines, you will see not only case law that has referenced that section, but also references in *MacDonald & Wilton, Child Support Guidelines Law and Practice* and other family law commentary:

How to KeyCite a Regulation

You can KeyCite a regulatory section either by name or by citation, using the usual KeyCite legislation templates found on the Home page of most WestlaweCARSWELL services or accessible via the KeyCiteCanada Home page link on the toolbar at the top of any WestlaweCARSWELL page.

To KeyCite a regulation by title:

1. In the Find/KeyCite a Document section at the bottom of the home page, select the **KeyCite** button.
2. Enter all or part of the regulation title in the **Title** box, e.g. Title: "child support guidelines". [Tip: You may enter any distinctive words that appear in either or both the title of the regulation or its enabling act]
3. Enter the section number in the **Section** box, e.g. 2.
4. Choose the appropriate jurisdiction from the dropdown list in the **Jurisdiction** box, e.g. Federal (optional).
5. Click **GO**.

To KeyCite a regulation by citation:

To KeyCite a regulation by citation:

1. In the Find/KeyCite a Document section at the bottom of the home page, select the **KeyCite** button.
2. Enter the citation in the **Citation** box, e.g. "SOR/97-175, s. 16".

To KeyCite a Regulation from the full text of a regulation section:
